# Let's start your democracy journey. Take the first step. Preregister to vote!

Our records indicate you may be eligible to preregister to vote in Michigan. If you are already preregistered, or need to check your status, visit [Michigan.gov/PreRegtoVote](https://Michigan.gov/PreRegtoVote).

## WHAT IS PREREGISTRATION?

Preregistration allows 16 to 17.5-year-olds to “preregister” to become a registered voter in Michigan. If you preregister to vote, you will be automatically registered to vote when you turn 17.5 and will receive a voter information card from your local clerk.

To preregister, you must be:

- Between 16 and 17.5 years old
- A U.S. citizen
- A Michigan resident
- A resident of the city or township in which you're applying

## You can preregister:



### Online.

Visit [Michigan.gov/PreRegtoVote](https://Michigan.gov/PreRegtoVote). You'll need your Michigan driver's license or state ID.



### By mail.

Complete the preregistration form attached to this mailer. If your address has changed from the address listed, go online to [Michigan.gov/PreRegtoVote](https://Michigan.gov/PreRegtoVote) to register and update your address.



### In person at your local clerk's office.

Find your local clerk's office at [Michigan.gov/Vote](https://Michigan.gov/Vote) by selecting “Your Clerk” from the options provided.

# More information



## Preregistration will allow you to vote when you turn 18, but not right away. You can vote only after you:

- Are at least 18 years old by Election Day.
- Have lived in your Michigan city or township for at least 30 days.
- Affirm that you are a United States citizen when voting.

### WHAT ARE MY VOTING OPTIONS?

- Preregister: You can preregister to vote between the ages of 16 and 17.5. Once you have preregistered, there is no need to register again.
- Register: If you don't preregister to vote, you can register to vote when you turn 17.5 years old.
- Remember to update your voter registration if there's any change to your name or address.
- Whether you preregistered to vote or registered to vote, to vote on Election Day, you must be:
  - At least 18 years old
  - A U.S. citizen
  - A resident of your city or township for at least 30 days before Election Day
  - Not currently serving a sentence in a jail or prison
